

White Wines

2016 Sierra Foothills Chardonnay \$15
Wonderful balance of light oak and tropical fruit flavors. Rich and full on the palate with a nice, lingering finish.

2016 Calaveras County Ghirardelli Bianco \$20
Light and crisp with a bright citrus finish. Made with the small planting of white grapes at the historic Ghirardelli vineyard in Burson. A refreshing blend of Golden Chasselas, Burger and French Colombard.

2016 Mokelumne River Pinot Grigio \$18
A great "anytime" beverage that is light and crisp, with slender hints of refreshing grapefruit. This wine pairs nicely with light pastas, seafood, and poultry.

2016 Calaveras County Mistral Viognier \$18
Our Mistral is named for the fierce wind that sweeps through Southern France. This Viognier captures ripe fruit flavors, and spicy, floral aromas.

2017 Santa Barbara Gewürztraminer \$18
With a fragrance that can be described as "drinking roses" this wine makes a charming companion to cheese and fruits.

2015 Calaveras "Catherine's Cuvee" Muscat \$16
Named for our daughter, Catherine's Cuvee is charming, and delicate. Wonderfully fruity and floral with notes of soft honey.

2017 White Zinfandel \$10
An over 30-year Foothill tradition, our White Zinfandel is packed with strawberry, cherry and raspberry essence. This delightful wine is perfect for sipping on the patio or by the fireplace.

Sparkling White Wine \$16
This sparkling wine is a blend of Chardonnay and Chenin Blanc. Refreshingly bubbly and toasty, it's perfect for celebrating any occasion!

Red Wines

2016 Calaveras County Jeunesse \$24
A juicy blend of Ghirardelli Zinfandel and Cinsaut. Our Jeunesse has flavors of ripe Bing cherry and raspberry with smoky undertones.

2016 Mokelumne River Pinot Noir \$28
Incredibly smooth, with a mouth filling wallop of caramel & cherry.

2013 Calaveras County Dogtown Merlot \$24
Complex with vanilla, black fruit and dark cherry flavors.

2014 Calaveras County Old Vine Zinfandel \$24
By blending three Calaveras vineyards planted between 40 and 100 years ago we have captured the diversity of Sierra Foothill Zinfandel. Wonderful fruit, spice and oak, with a deep berry center that floats through the finish. **2014 available for wine club only****

2014 Calaveras County Ghirardelli Zinfandel \$26
This over 115 year old vineyard is the oldest in Calaveras County. Five generations of the Ghirardelli family have tended to these same unyielding dry farmed vines. A great Zin that is layered with complexities, this wine can be sipped alone or paired with many meals!

2014 Amador County Clockspring Zinfandel \$26
This is a wonderful example of the best of Amador Zinfandels. It is intensely spicy with layers of black pepper and a smooth finish.

2013 Sierra Foothills Syrah \$24
Syrah is one of the noble grape varieties of France. It is an inky dark wine, rich with spice. **Sold out!**

2013 Calaveras Eagle's Nest Petite Sirah \$24
Soft, mature tannins and layers of complex flavor. Bright pomegranate with notes of bacon, anise, cocoa and Tahitian vanilla.

2013 Calaveras Alicante Bouschet "Alley Cat" \$28
Alicante grapes are rare, less than 1% is planted in California. These grapes have purple pulp, which adds intense color and fabulous flavor to this wine.

2015 Calaveras County Cabernet Sauvignon \$18
This is a wonderful Cab with loads of deep berry fruit and light notes of soft oak.

2013 Calaveras "Triumph" Cabernet Sauvignon \$30
Triumph is a Meritage-style Bordeaux blend of Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc and Merlot. All of these grapes harvested from Calaveras County.

2015 Robert's Cuvée Late Harvest Zin \$25
Sugar and spice and everything nice, that's what Robert's Cuvee is made of. This late harvest is a total confection of blackberry jam and spice. Named for our son, who was born in the month of October, the month when these grapes are harvested.

2012 Clockspring Zinfandel Port \$32
Like a lesson from the Kama Sutra, this port takes you into forbidden places. Satisfy your desires with this fruit of the vine!
